ATTENDANCE

There will be no breakfast served at summer school this year. Students should bring a snack for their 3rd period class.

CLASS FEES

As you read through the class descriptions, you will notice that some classes have a class fee. This fee is to help cover the cost of supplies for the class. **Please pay class fees by the first week of classes.** Fees can be paid to the teacher or the school office. Please make checks payable to the School District of Oakfield. REGISTRATION

A registration form and class description listings are contained in this booklet. Each class has a limited amount of spots, so classes are filled on a first come, first serve basis. **Please return completed forms no later than Monday, May 1. They can be dropped off at the Oakfield Elementary or Middle/High School.** It can also be emailed to Becky Doyle at bdoyle@oakfield.k12.wi.us. Please indicate Summer School Registration in the subject line. Grade level means the grade your child is entering for the 2023 - 2024 school year.

RESIDENT/NON-RESIDENT STATUS

Children living in the School District of Oakfield for all or part of the summer, whether with grandparents, family members, or friends, are considered residents of the District. Students who are open enrolled in our district during the school year are also eligible for summer school classes at no additional cost.

Children who live in other school districts and DO NOT attend Oakfield School District during the school year may join the School District of Oakfield Summer School program for a fee of \$100 per student. This fee can be paid when the registration form is sent in or on the first day of classes. Please make checks payable to the School District of Oakfield.

HIGH SCHOOL CLASSES

High School students are limited this year due to the MS/HS renovation project. If you would like to be a part of a class not listed for the high school students, please contact Mrs. Doyle and she will be happy to create a plan with you.

All classes needed for credit recovery should be discussed with Mr. Brown and Ms. Bakri at the Middle/High School. The Middle/High School phone number is 583-3141.

TRANSPORTATION

Bus transportation to Oakfield Elementary School and Oakfield Middle/High School for the 8:00 a.m. sessions will be provided to students outside of the village who reside within the district. Students living outside of the village will be provided with bus transportation to their homes starting at 12:00 PM each day.

PLEASE NOTE: As indicated above, bus transportation is only provided at designated times. In some instances it will then be necessary for students to arrange for their own transportation. Students wishing to take only one class are not allowed to be in the building for the remainder of the day. **If students are at the school, they need to be taking a class.**

VOLUNTEERS

All students in grades K - 8 are encouraged to participate in Summer School. We will not be using student volunteers to support classes.

| ARTS AND CRAFTS | 2 - 5 |

| BASKETBALL | 2 - 8 |
| Players will receive instruction on the proper form when shooting a basketball. Players will get to work on their form by doing various shooting drills. | BOARD GAMES GALORE | 2 - 3 |

| BOOK CLUBS | 6 - 8 |

| DANCE TEAM | 2 - 8 |
| Do you love dancing to the beat everytime your favorite song comes on? Or cheering on your favorite sports team? In this class students will learn the fundamentals of dance and cheer. After learning the basics, we will combine those moves into fun and exciting cheer/dance routines to popular hit songs. We will even get the opportunity to perform for a live audience! | |

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| ENTREPRENEURSHIP & FINANCIAL LITERACY | 4 - 8 |
| Calling all future entrepreneurs...it's time to start a plan. In this class you will design a business plan throughout the course of the summer and be ready to share your project or product the last week of summer school. Students will learn all about the basics of what it means to be a business owner and practice some basic workplace skills. Students will also learn about budgets, money management, investments, and the costs of everyday living. What great skills to learn at an early age! | |
| FANTASTIC FIRST GRADE PREP | 1 |
| Let's gear up for first grade, and let's get ready for some fun! This summer program will include enjoying authors such as Mo Willems, expanding marvelous math skills, and building on individual reading and writing foundations. Morning meetings will include fun activities, songs, and valuable time with friends. Sign up and stay engaged in fantastic first-grade learning this summer! | |
| FISHING ADVENTURE (2 HR. CLASS) | 5- 8 |
| Students will review knot tying and casting skills. They will learn fishing rules and ethics. They will find out how to identify native fish. It is possible they will visit with a game warden and learn about fly-fishing. Several trips to local fishing locations will be planned. It will be helpful, but not necessary, for students to have their own equipment. Class Fee: \$10.00 | |
| FLAG FOOTBALL & FUNDAMENTALS | 4 - 6 |
| Students will learn the fundamentals of football. They will learn to throw, catch, and block as well as learning basic strategies of football. Teamwork and playing as one team will be stressed and enforced. Games will be played on most days of the session. Both males and females are encouraged to attend. | |
| GENIUS HOUR | 4 - 5 |
| Have you ever wondered why something is the way it is? Or wanted to learn something new and become an expert on it? In this class, you will become an expert on something you're interested in. We will be working on how to research something using reliable sources, making presentations, and sharing all that we became an expert on. | |
| GETTING READY FOR KINDERGARTEN | K |
| Students will get a feel for what a typical day in Kindergarten will look and feel like. There will be time for math and literacy along with fun activities and projects that will have the students being active and working together. All Kindergarten students will be in one section the entire morning of summer school. | |
| GUIDED READING | 2 - 5 |
| Students will continue their reading intervention program during summer school using the same materials and strategies. Only students who attend the Reading Intervention Program during the school year will be accepted into this class. TEACHER RECOMMENDATION REQUIRED | |
| INTRODUCTION TO BAND | 6 |
| This course will introduce students to band. Students will learn basic techniques specific to his/her instrument choice. Special attention will be put on correct body & hand position, quality tone production, and first notes. Students will be placed in homogeneous instrument classes. | |
| JR POLICE ACADEMY (2 HR. CLASS) | 4 - 8 |
| This class will bring together students and police officers in a safe, drug-free environment to inspire solid values. They will experience a mock crime scene, visits from members of the Detective Bureau, SWAT Team, Drug Recognition expert, Dive team, Boat Patrol, Probations & Parole, School Resource Officer, Traffic & Bike Patrol, Jail Officer, a K-9 Officer & possible field trips. | |
| MATH ATTACK | 6 - 8 |
| This class is geared toward students going into middle school math who want to enhance their math skills over the summer. There will be daily math activities, math puzzles, problem solving and more! | |

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| MATH MANIA | 2 - 5 |
| Prevent the Summer Slide as students continue to work on grade level standards in fun, hands-on, engaging ways. Math games, manipulatives, and online resources will be used to provide differentiated instruction to all students. Students will review what they learned this past year and build on new skills to prepare for the next grade level. Are you ready to think like a mathematician? | |
| NEW WEEK, NEW THEME | 2 - 3 |
| If you love variety, this is the class for you. Each week students will explore a new theme. Dinosaurs, solar system, pets, rainforests, sea creatures, and more. Your brain will be filled with new knowledge on a variety of topics by the end of summer school. | |
| REVVED UP FOR LITERACY | 2 - 5 |
| Getting your reading minutes in each day at Summer School, so you can enjoy your afternoon. This class will keep students reading, writing, and working with words to prevent the Summer Slide. Students will have access to their iReady Reading lessons, Raz-Kids, Accelerated Reader, and other literacy programs that our school provides during the school year. Students will be provided with fun ways to enhance their grade level literacy skills. Small group reading or Book Clubs will be used on a daily basis to keep kids engaged and finishing lots of books. | |
| SOCCER | 4 - 5 |
| This class will take players through weekly sessions of fundamental skill building and competitive drills/games to develop self-confidence in practice and game situations. Focus will be on basic fundamentals of player development. | |
| SOMETHING SOCIAL | 2 - 6 |
| Let's go team! Together students will be working on strengthening their social skills while engaging in summer themed activities to build strategies to navigate through challenges they face. Zones of Regulation and other resources will be used to enhance their social emotional learning needs while creating new friendships in a social environment. *Students in grades 4 - 6 will be using an Escape Room to enhance their learning. | |
| STEM | 2 - 8 |
| Are you ready for a SCIENCE ADVENTURE ? We are going to use science to solve crimes and create new inventions. We are going to do some fun experiments and use some new technology while doing it. Science is an adventure and this summer is going to be a fun ride. | |
| STRENGTH & CONDITIONING | 9 - 12 |
| Due to the renovation at the MS/HS this class will take place at the YMCA in Fond du Lac. Meet Coach Rickert at the elementary school at 7:00 to board the van to take you to the YMCA for your morning workout. Students with drivers licenses can meet him there at 7:30 AM. Fee: \$20 (paid to YMCA for a temporary membership) | |
| TENNIBALL | 5 - 8 |
| This is a combination of baseball and softball in the tennis court. Players will get a chance to work on various fundamentals while playing the game. Players will work on proper techniques for throwing, fielding, and hitting with a tennis ball. | |
| VIRTUAL FIELD TRIP | 4 - 8 |
| Have you ever wanted to travel the world and learn more about different countries, cultures, and more? This class is for you. Using technology, you can travel the world without leaving Oakfield and take a "vacation" every day of summer school. | |
| VOLLEYBALL | 2 - 5 |
| This course will consist of demonstrations, individual drills, and team drills. It is designed to teach fundamentals and provide an opportunity for individual skill development. These skills include serving, passing, defense, attacking, blocking, and setting.
